- All students are automatically enrolled in LEAD – Character, Leadership and Social Responsibility 15, 25 or 35, Physical Education 10, 20 or 30
- Dance students will automatically be enrolled in Dance 25, 35 – and depending on the schedule – Contemporary or Ballet 25 or 35
- CALM 20 (AB Education graduation required course – 3 credit) is offered at Edge in Grade 10. The course is offered with Sports Medicine 15 (3 credits). Students earn 6 High School credits with this course combination.
- Language Challenges – Spanish or French. Please contact Mrs. Fridd if you are interested in more information about language challenge courses.

Academic Schedule

Edge’s academic schedule is built based upon student course selections. Please note that we will do our best to accommodate changes after a student’s schedule is created; however there are determining factors like class sizes and course conflicts that may prevent us from being able to accommodate all requests. If enrolment is not sufficient in a course, it may not be offered. Students are strongly encouraged to have full schedules. Unscheduled blocks will be assigned as spares (Grades 11 and 12 only). Online courses are delivered by Golden Hills. Students are signed up at Edge in ilearn. Students enrolled in online courses will be required to attend class in the learning commons.

SAT

Students create a SAT account and sign up, pay, and choose a writing centre for this test on the [SAT website](#). Studying for the SAT can be done through [Bluebook](#). SAT scores are forwarded to US Colleges [Common Application](#).

myPass

Starting in Grade 10, all students have access to a Detailed Academic Report (DAR – which highlights courses and marks for high school) on myPass. myPass is an Alberta Education self-service website for students. Register using your personal email (not your ilearn email) [here](#).

NCAA Eligibility

Students considering attending US schools and playing on athletic teams must first [register here](#). **Registration begins in Grade 10**; certification by the NCAA Eligibility Center is mandatory for eligibility to compete in NCAA Division I or II schools. You also need to be registered with a Certification Account before you can make official visits or sign a National Letter of Intent in Division I or II.
