### MacDonald Named One of Canada's Top 10 U18 Changemakers



One of our Grade 8 student-athletes, golfer Luke MacDonald, has been doing some truly amazing work raising awareness and funds for the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation. Earlier this week in Toronto, he was recognized with “The Shake the Movers Award for Civic Engagement and Advocacy” at the Children First Canada The Future is Now Awards (celebrating Canada’s Top 10 U18 Changemakers).

Luke has become a formidable advocate for children living with Type 1 Diabetes (T1D), a cause that has been close to his heart since his diagnosis at the tender age of 5. Understanding the profound impact of T1D on children and their families, Luke has dedicated himself to government advocacy, fundraising, mentorship, and youth ambassadorship with JDRF (formerly known as the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation) from the very moment of his diagnosis.

From forming “Team Luke” and raising over \$50,000 for the JDRF Walk to speaking at various JDRF events and leading fundraising efforts, Luke has exemplified remarkable leadership and determination in his mission to support those affected by T1D. His passion for advocacy led him to Ottawa, where he tirelessly lobbied the Federal Government for increased support for individuals living with T1D through the Kids for a Cure initiative.

Recognizing the importance of peer support, Luke extends a helping hand to newly diagnosed children, sharing his own experiences to reassure them that they are not alone in their journey. He understands the psychological toll of T1D and advocates for mental health support for children grappling with the challenges of the disease.

Luke’s commitment to raising awareness about T1D is exemplified by his participation in initiatives such as living atop a flagpole for 24 hours to commemorate the 100-year anniversary of insulin’s discovery—a life-saving medicine crucial for individuals like Luke. Through speaking engagements and fundraising endeavors, Luke educates the public about the critical need for T1D research and technology advancements.

# 16 Selected in 2024 WHL Draft, Setting CSSHL Record

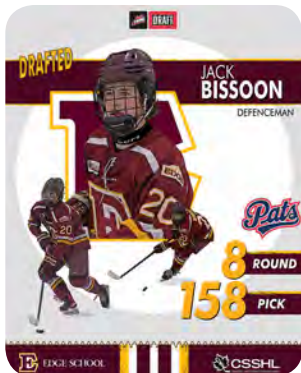
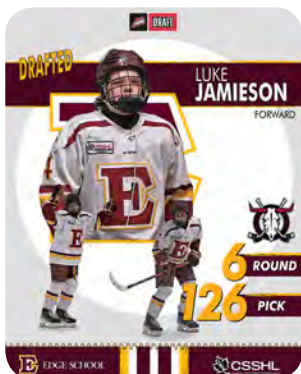
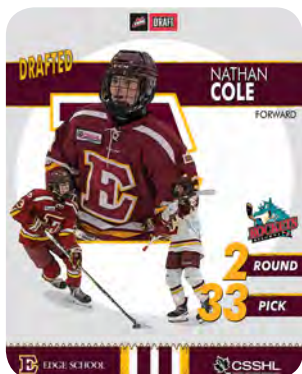
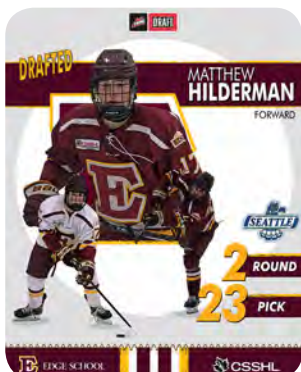
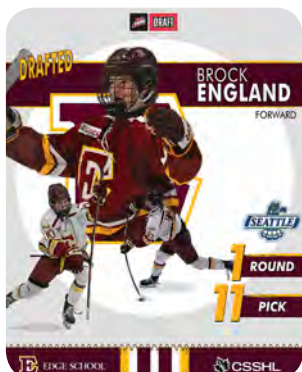


16 Mountaineers were selected in the 2024 WHL Draft, marking a program high for a WHL Draft, and also setting a CSSHL record. The previous high for our program was 14 selections in 2022. The draft got off to a highly anticipated start as 14-year-old Mountaineer, Landon DuPont, was selected 1st overall by the Everett Silvertips (after receiving exceptional status by the WHL in early April). It was the first time that a Mountaineer has been taken 1st overall.

Afterwards, it didn't take long for another Edge student-athlete to be taken off the board after that, with Aden Bouchard going 3rd overall to the Tri-City Americans. It marked the third straight year that the Americans have selected a Mountaineer in the 1st round (Jackson Smith, 2nd overall - 2022, Cruz Pavao, 13th overall - 2023). Three more of our players would be taken to finish off the first round (Brock England - 3rd overall, Mirco Dufour - 19th overall, Jordin St. Louis - 20th overall). The five total first round picks is the most we've ever seen selected in the WHL Draft (previous high was four in 2022).

Congratulations to all of you on being drafted. No matter where hockey takes you, we know that this will always be a very memorable day for all of you!

For our student-athletes not taken in the draft, keep your head up and keep working hard. You have plenty of role models to look to, including Edge alumnus Jake Bean, who went undrafted in his WHL draft year. Stay focused and committed to your craft – there are plenty of opportunities to come.

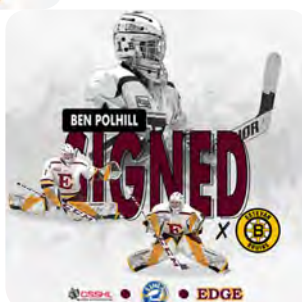

# Unbelievable Season for Parascak Comes to a Close



It wasn't the finish the Prince George Cougars or Terik Parascak wanted, losing 2-1 in double overtime of game six of the WHL Western Conference Championship (on a goal by former Mountaineer Josh Davies no less).

But with the dust settled, it gives us a chance to recap a phenomenal season for the super rookie and the Prince George Cougars.

Soon to be class of 2024 grad, Terik Parascak, had quite the year to remember ahead of the NHL Draft (he's ranked 15th among North American skaters by NHL Central Scouting):

- 43 goals, 62 assists, 105 points in 68 games
- 8th in WHL scoring overall, led all rookies in goals and points
- PG rookie franchise history for goals and points
- Rookie of the Week – seven times
- Rookie of the Month – three times
- Finalist for the Jim Piggott Memorial Trophy (WHL Rookie of the Year)
- WHL BC Division 2nd Team All-Star Team
- 1st time a WHL rookie surpassed the 100-point plateau since 1998-99 (Pavel Brendl, 134)
- Named to CHL Top Prospects Game and to CHL All-Rookie Team
- 14 points in 12 playoff games

Perry's individual success helped contribute to major team success for the Cougars as well, leading to the team's best regular season ever:

- Finished 1st overall in the WHL Western Conference (1st time)
- Most wins in a season (49)
- Most points in a season (102)
- Most goals scored (316)
- Best goal differential (129)

Brooke and her teammates came away with a silver medal and she was also named the top goaltender of the tournament.

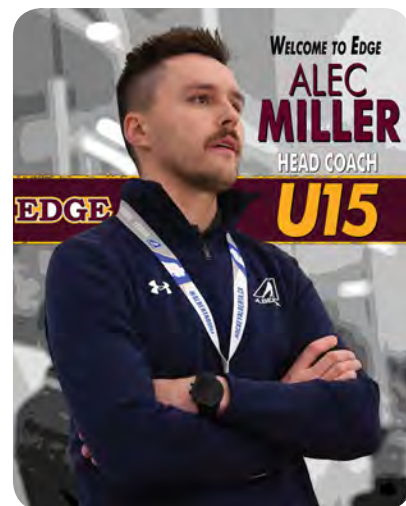

## Unger, Degenstein Win WHL Championship



Congratulations to former Mountaineers Jackson Unger and Noah Degenstein on winning the Ed Chynoweth Cup with the Moose Jaw Warriors – the team's 1st WHL Championship in franchise history.

Jackson had a dominant this season for Moose Jaw. The WHL Goaltender of the Year nominee Jackson Unger stood tall with a 16-1-2 record, a 2.92 goals-against average and a 0.910 save percentage throughout the postseason, highlighted by a 37-save effort in Game 2 of the WHL Championship. The workhorse netminder led the league with

35 regular-season wins and finished second in minutes played (3,133) and third in saves (1,593).

Noah played in 40 games with the Warriors in the regular season, registering three assists.

Unfortunately for Moose Jaw, they would go on to lose in the Memorial Cup semifinal against the eventual champion, Saginaw Spirit. Regardless of the outcome, it was the first time in history that the Warriors made it to the Memorial Cup and a season to remember for Jackson, Noah and their teammates.

## Elick, Canada Win Gold at U18 World Championships

Congratulations to Charlie Elick on winning Gold with Team Canada at the 2024 Under-18 IIHF Men's World Championship!

This is the third time that Charlie has represented Canada on the world stage. He suited up with Team Canada at the U17 World Hockey Challenge (2022) and Hlinka Gretzky Cup (2023).

At the Hlinka Gretzky Cup, Canada also won the Gold Medal, giving Chuck two championships with the National team in only a 10-month span.

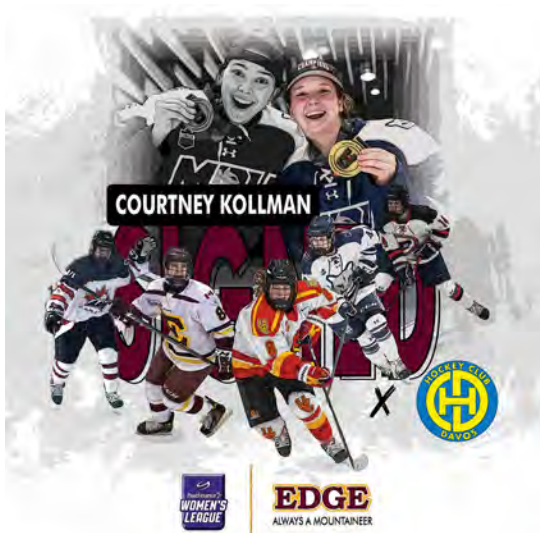

## Kollman going Pro with HC Davos



After finishing her university career with the University of Calgary Dinos, Courtney Kollman is joining HC Davos, playing out of the top-tier Swiss Women's Hockey League (SWHL A).

The class of 2018 grad has carved out a very impressive career since playing for our Female Prep team for two seasons, where she compiled 56 points (34 G, 22 A) in 44 CSSHL games (regular season and playoffs).

In 2017/18, she represented Team Canada at the World Women's U18 Championship, and committed to Robert Morris University in the NCAA. She played two seasons with RMU before transferring back to Calgary to attend Mount Royal University. With the Cougars, Courtney was nearly a point per game player (20 G, 25 A in 47 games), and helped MRU win their first ever U SPORTS National Championship in 2022/23.

For her last year of U SPORTS eligibility, Courtney transferred to the University of Calgary. She had an outstanding season with the Dinos, scoring 28 points (11 G, 17 A) in 27 games regular season games.

In all three of her U SPORTS seasons, she was named a Canada West 2nd Team All-Star.
