

- History made in men's 17U basketball, as Team Alberta captured its first-ever gold medal at the Games with Mountaineers Lemar Shir, Jahkeem Damaj, and Kade McGeachy leading the way.
- Another gold for Mountaineer Avery Zulak with Team Alberta's 17U women's basketball squad.







#### **Three Alumni Claim Calder Cup**

## **Wozniewicz Drafted by Ottawa Charge**




Edge School class of 2021 grad, Sarah Wozniewicz, was selected in the third round, fifth overall by the Ottawa Charge in the 2025 Professional Women's Hockey League (PWHL) Draft, marking a major milestone in her impressive hockey journey.

Wozzy has always turned heads since her time with our hockey program. After putting up dominant numbers in the CSSHL, including a 52-point season in 2019-20 (leading the Female U18 Prep team to a CSSHL Championship), Woz went on to represent Canada at the U18 Women's World Championship that same year. Since graduating, she has thrived in the NCAA with the Wisconsin Badgers - winning two NCAA National Championships.

A cool sidebar that came from Sarah being drafted is that she is reunited with former head coach Carla MacLeod, who coached her during her four seasons at Edge.

"I'm super excited to play under her again; she's a great coach," Wozniewicz said. "It's a definitely a familiar face to see, it's very comforting. "It's a whole circle moment. I never thought she would be coaching in the PWHL when I was at Edge."

#### Four Mountaineers Selected in 2025 NHL Draft



It was a milestone year for Edge School at the 2025 NHL Draft, as four Mountaineer alumni heard their names called and took the next step toward their professional hockey dreams. It was the first time that four Mountaineers have been selected in one NHL draft year. The previous high for NHL draft picks in one year was three – 2012 (Matt Dumba, Mitch Moroz, Coda Gordon) and 2024 (Terik Parascak, Charlie Elick, Eric Jamieson).

- Jackson Smith led the way, selected in the first round, 14th overall.
- Nathan Behm was taken in the third round, 66th overall.
- Carter Klippenstein was selected in the fourth round, 123rd overall.
- Luke Vlooswyk was picked in the fifth round, 157th overall.

This year's draft class highlights the depth of talent and development within the Edge hockey program. Congratulations to Jackson, Nathan, Carter and Luke — we can't wait to watch you continue your journeys at the next level.






#### **Three Post-Secondary Commitments**

### 25th Anniversary Recap

What a year! As we reflect on Edge School's 25th Anniversary, we look back in gratitude at the activities, celebrations and achievements throughout the 2024/25 school year.

Festivities began in September, 2024 with our opening ceremonies. As we launched the celebratory year, we honoured two of our cherished patrons, Bruce Stuart and Dave Duckett. These gentlemen have been instrumental in their unwavering commitment to support our student-athletes – past, present and future. Their generosity has helped shape Edge School and a monument was unveiled acknowledging their contributions, including their donations to establish our field, now known as the Stuart, Duckett Field.

Throughout the year, student-athletes represented Edge School across the globe and captured the "E" Around the World in photographs, demonstrating how far-reaching Edge can be.

Commemorative coffee and chocolate bars were created and sold as fundraisers to support the Edge School Endowment Fund. This legacy will provide sustainable financial funding for future student-athletes to benefit from their experience in academic, athletic and character development at Edge School.

The 25th Anniversary focus was embedded in many activities throughout the year including: career day, Homecoming, Move Mountains and significant celebrations at the Edge Legacy Dinner.

Guests enjoyed hearing the Edge School origin story and how the dream of Edge became a reality, in spite of the obstacles.

The evening also featured four members of the 1989 Calgary Flames Stanley Cup Championship team – Lanny McDonald, Colin Patterson, Joel Otto and Doug Gilmour. The entire audience was captivated as these gentlemen relived that year, that team, the series and beating the odds.

The Ross Glen Hall at Mount Royal University proved to be the perfect venue for the ELD and nearly \$15,000 (net) was raised! These funds are allocated to Edge School's financial aid program, which benefits student-athletes requiring financial assistance, who otherwise would not be able to attend Edge School. As our school population continues to grow with 450 student-athletes enrolled this coming year, we want to minimize financial barriers whenever possible for those qualifying families in need.

The 25th Anniversary year concluded in June with the closing ceremonies highlighting the Time Capsule. This keepsake includes many items indicative to Edge School and will live quietly under the E rock for another 25 years.
