



U18 Prep Teams Impress at Circle K, Mandi Schwartz Tournaments



Our female and male U18 Prep hockey teams both delivered standout performances at two premier events in December.

At the Mandi Schwartz Tournament, our Female U18 Prep Mountaineers recorded their strongest finish since 2019, battling their way to a bronze medal in a highly competitive field.

The group posted a 3-1-1 record, highlighted by a thrilling 4–3 victory over the AFHL top-seeded St. Albert Slash, showcasing the team's resilience and ability to rise in big moments.

Between the pipes, Alexis Ehrman and Jenna Ring were locked in, combining for a 1.33 goals-against average, 0.947 save percentage, and one shutout – a steady foundation that allowed the group to compete every game.

Up front, Sam Baker, Lila Deis, and Abby Lee created consistent offensive pressure and dominated as a line combining for 16 points (7G, 9A) over five games.

On the male side, our U18 Prep Mountaineers put together an impressive run of their own at the Circle K Classic, advancing to the semifinals and finishing as the last remaining Calgary-based team in the tournament.

Edge's run came to an end to the eventual tournament champions, the St. Louis AAA Blues. Facing an older, more physically mature group, our younger lineup competed hard but ran out of steam after a demanding schedule and a short turnaround between games.

One of the defining moments of the tournament came in a dramatic quarter-final victory over the Regina Pat Canadians. Edge scored with just 11 seconds remaining to force overtime, then secured the win in OT in what was an emotional, high-intensity battle against one of the tournament's most talented teams.

- Ashton McCann led the entire tournament with eight goals, including three game-winners (two of in overtime) and the late game-tying goal against Regina. His 10 points in six games were fourth most at the event.
- Carsten Leyerzapf delivered a strong performance in net, giving the team a chance to win every night with his consistency and compete.
- Remy Koch, the youngest defenceman in the tournament, impressed throughout with his relentless compete level and impact in key moments.

Kudos to both teams on these great showings as they build momentum for the second half of the season leading into CSSHL playoffs.



Hockey Skill Academy – Bauer Winter Championship

Twelve of our hockey skill academy student-athletes were back in action in early December, competing with their 2013 AAA Sauce team at the Bauer Winter Championship in Edmonton, and they delivered in a big way.

For the second straight year, the group captured tournament championship honours, going undefeated throughout the event and outscoring opponents 41–9.

It was a complete team effort from start to finish, highlighted by several standout performances:

- Bennett Tice was named Goaltender of the Tournament, allowing just one goal and recording two shutouts across three games.
- Enzo Fournier led the tournament offensively, posting 19 points (11 G, 8 A) in six games, including a dominant 2-goal, 2-assist performance in the championship game.
- The title was sealed with a 4-1 win over a strong team from Washington, capping off an impressive run and another championship moment for our hockey skill academy athletes.

We are proud to celebrate another student-athlete who has announced their commitment to continue their academic and athletic career at the post-secondary level next year.

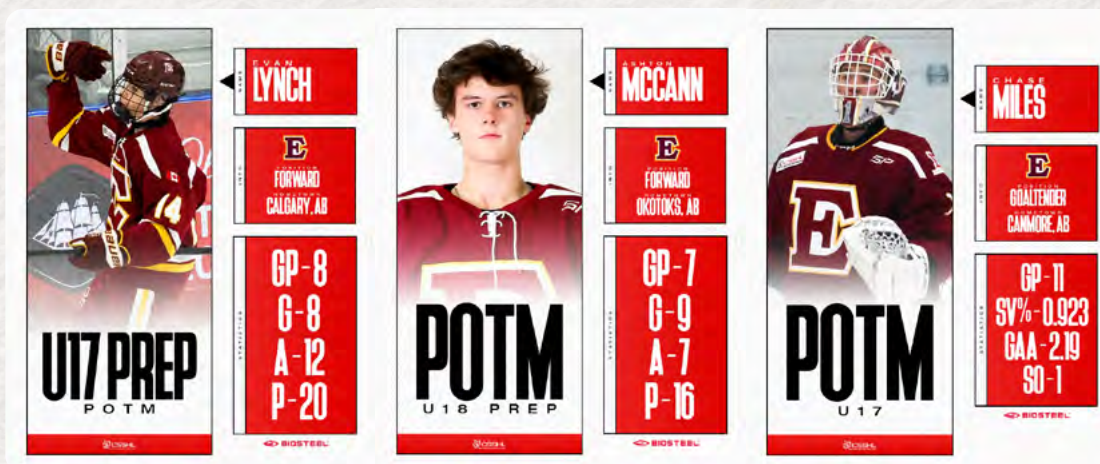

Lynch, McCann, Miles Named CSSHL Players of the Month



Congratulations to Evan Lynch, Ashton McCann and Chase Miles on being named CSSHL Players of the Month! All three players have been excellent on their respective teams – delivering standout performances on a nightly basis.

Evan leads the U17 Prep division with 1.82 points per game (31 points in 17 games) and is tied for the overall scoring lead. Named as the U17 Prep player of the month for September/October, Evan racked up 20 points (8 G, 12 A) in only eight games played.

Ashton is fifth in the U18 Prep scoring race, with 34 points (15 G, 19 A) in 20 games. Named the U18 Prep December player of the month, he led all U18 Prep skaters with nine goals and 16 points.

Chase meanwhile was named the U17 division player of the month for November. In 11 games played, Chase had a 0.923 SV%, 2.19 GAA and one shutout. On the season, he has compiled a 14-1 record with a 1.87 GAA and 0.933 SV% to go along with two shutouts. His 14 wins are top in the U17 division (next closest goaltender has nine), and has arguably been one of the top goaltenders across the entire CSSHL this season.

On Nov. 22, Edge class of 2021 grad, Sarah Wozniewicz, made her Professional Women's Hockey League debut with the Ottawa Charge.

Since stepping onto the ice at the professional level, Sarah is steadily becoming a standout contributor, recording four points (2 G, 2 A) in her last four games.

Her breakthrough moment came on Dec. 21, scoring her first PWHL goal – an overtime game-winner against Minnesota. Her goal on Jan. 3, also against Minnesota, stood up as another game-winning goal.

Heffernan Named to Forbes 30 Under 30



Former Edge School Mountaineer, Karly Heffernan, has been recognized on the Forbes 30 Under 30 list in the Manufacturing & Industry (2026) for her work as co-founder of Hardline, the first voice-first platform designed specifically for construction sites.

Hardline streamlines construction communication by automatically recording phone calls and on-site conversations, then summarizing and documenting them to improve workflow and efficiency. Since its launch, the startup has raised \$405,000, grown to 70 users and partners with six construction pilot sites.

A 2019 graduate of Harvard College, Karly was a four-year member of the Harvard Women's Ice Hockey Team. She played two seasons with the Crimson, notching 44 points before suffering a career-ending injury.

On the international level, Heffernan shined by helping Team Canada win back-to-back IIHF U18 World Championships in 2013 and 2014. In the 2013 tournament Gold Medal Game, Karly scored the game-winning-goal in overtime to help her team lift the World Championship trophy.

Today, Karly is breaking through the male-dominated construction industry to become a leader in the construction tech space. She and her team hope to innovate and modernize construction communication inefficiencies using AI.

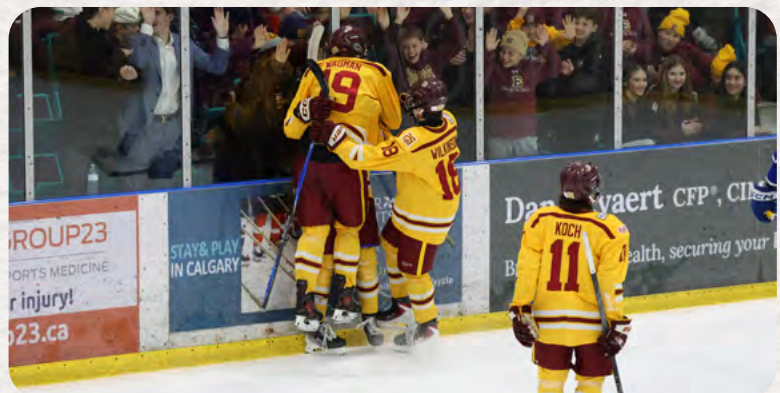
Year-End Fundraising Appeal – Thank You!
