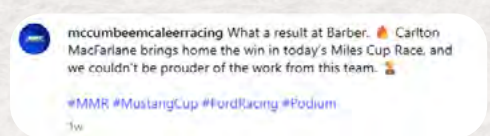

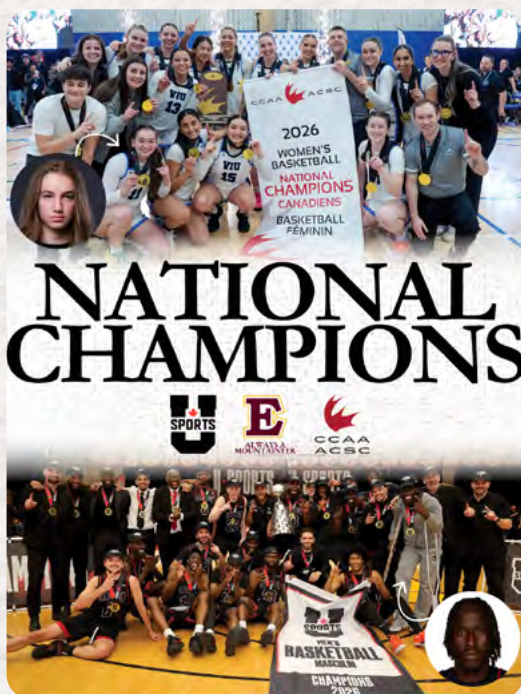

Homegrown Talent Returns: Four Alumni Sign with Calgary Surge



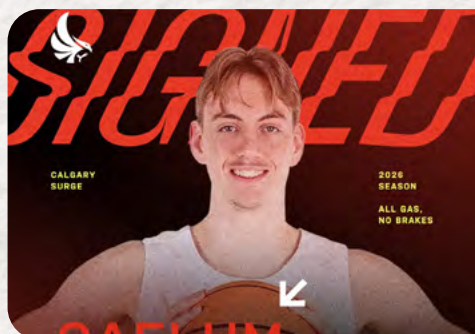
There's something special about coming home – and this summer, four Edge School alumni are doing just that.

The Calgary Surge have added a strong Mountaineer presence to their roster with the signings of MJ Okado, Joshua Francis, Caelum Swanton-Rodger, and Thow Biel – four athletes whose journeys have taken them across the country and beyond, and now back to where it all began.

Leading the group is MJ Okado (Class of 2021), returning to Calgary after an outstanding career with Carleton University. A U SPORTS National Champion and one of the Ravens' all-time greats, Okado leaves Carleton with over 1,000 career points and recognition as the program's Outstanding Graduating Male Athlete. Now, he brings his leadership and championship pedigree back to his hometown, ready to make an impact in front of the community that helped shape him.



Joshua Francis is currently with the University of Lethbridge following an impressive freshman season at Memorial University, where he earned AUS All-Rookie honours. His rapid development on the East Coast has set the stage for the next step in his career, as he looks to continue building momentum with the Surge.



Adding size and presence to the lineup is Caelum Swanton-Rodger (Class of 2021), a 7'0 center coming off a dominant NCAA run with Old Dominion University. Known for his impact in the paint, Swanton-Rodger returns to Calgary with both high-level experience and a strong connection to the local basketball community.



Rounding out the group is Thow Biel (Class of 2020), who is expected to join the team following a solid season at the University of Maine. Biel averaged 11.7 points, 4.2 rebounds, and 1.3 assists per game while shooting 44.6% from the field – numbers that reflect his consistency and versatility at the university level.

Together, this group represents the continued growth of Edge School's basketball program and its ability to develop athletes ready for the next level. More importantly, it's a full-circle moment – four alumni, back in Calgary, competing professionally in front of the same community that helped launch their journeys.
